

How to Draw an Eye

Directions:

Step 1 - Make a circle for the iris. The iris is the colored part of your eye and are most commonly brown, green, blue, or hazel. It controls the amount of light that enters your eye.

Step 2 - Add a curved line for the eyelid slightly overlapping the top portion of the iris. Eyelids protect your eyes and keep them moist.

Step 3 - Draw a curved line below the iris for the lower lid to constrain the sclera, which is the “white” of your eye and covers the entire outside of your eyeball.

Step 4 - Draw a small circle inside the iris for the pupil, a hole in the middle of your eye that contracts (shrinks) in bright light and dilates (grows) in duller light.



Step 5 - Add a curved line for the top of the eyelid. Shade the small circle black. Add shade to top right and lower left portions of the iris.

Step 6 - Add shadow to the top and lower portions of the eye.

Step 7 - Draw the tear duct in the corner closest to the nose by adding a u shape and adding shadow to make it more 3-dimensional.

Step 8 - Add eye lashes which are short curved hairs that grow on the edges of the eyelids to protect the eyes from dust.
