

Voting and the Electoral College

The United States has a special voting system used to elect the president called the Electoral College.

The Electoral College is a group of people called electors that cast votes to represent their state.

Each state has a different number of electors based on their population and size. When the majority of a state's voters votes for one of the candidates, that state will cast their number of Electoral College votes for that candidate.



The numbers on this map represent the number of electors each state has.
