

Frequently Used Korean



Two types of speech form in spoken Korean.

- Informal: Used to address people with **same age** or **younger**, in particular close friends.
- Formal: Used to talk to **older people** and in **formal social contexts**.

English	Informal Korean	Formal Korean
Hello	안녕 [Annyeong]	안녕하세요 [Annyeonghaseyo]
Bye	잘가 [Jal ga]	안녕히 가세요 [Annyeonghi gaseyo]
I am sorry	미안해 [Mianhae]	죄송합니다 [Joesonghabnida]
Thank you	고마워 [Gomawo]	고맙습니다 [Gomapseumnida]
I love you	사랑해 [Saranghae]	사랑합니다 [Saranghamnida]
Yes	응 [Eung]	네 [Ne]
No	아니 [Ani]	아니요 [Aniyo]
Good or I like it	좋아 [Joah]	좋아요 [Joahyo]
Bad or I don't like it	나빠 / 싫어 [Nappa / Sil-eo]	나빠요 / 싫어요 [Nappayo / Sileoyo]
Okay	알겠어 [Algesso]	알겠어요 [Algesseoyo]
