PICTURE: A NEW TOOLKIT ON ARTS EDUCATION FOR CITY'S YOUTH!

PHILADELPHIA, PA -- Community groups, recreation centers, after-school programs, and schools throughout the city will now be able to educate and empower children in culturally underserved areas with free access to a robust arts education program.

"Creating Legacies Thru Art", conceived by Art Sphere, Inc. (ASI), is one of the winning projects to receive a \$20,000 grant from the John S. and James L. Knight Foundation, as part of the Knight Arts Challenge. The challenge funds innovative projects that engage and enrich Philadelphia's communities.

The "Creating Legacies Thru Art" project will directly serve children in communities where budgets for visual arts programs have been significantly scaled back or cut completely. A free online catalog of curricula and resources will be developed and offered to learning partners seeking to provide their own unique arts education program. ASI will train teachers and volunteers to assist learning partners with hands-on instruction. The program will encourage a blended learning environment – fostering increased engagement of innovative technology and encouraging users to share feedback online, while preserving the undisputed value of face-to-face lessons.

"The most successful cities are often those where all people see themselves as creative beings, an approach they can use to both solve their own and the community's toughest challenges. With this program, Art Sphere is poised to help instill that belief in the city's youth," said Dennis Scholl, VP/arts at Knight Foundation.
